
Meeting a New Dog

- His eyes are half-moon you can see the whites of his eyes.




This dog is feeling happy. How do you know he's feeling happy?

- He's sitting down.








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It's a very hot day and Rufus needs to find his water bowl to have a cool drink and then find some shade. Can you help him make his way to his water bowl and kennel?














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Doggy Origami


Supplies needed:

- · Card or construction paper
- Scissors
- Markers or crayons
- Googly eyes, glue and a paddle-pop stick are optional



How to Start:

- Make a square from a piece of paper by folding a corner of the piece of paper over to touch the opposite side.
- **2.** Cut off the small rectangle at the top.
- Keep your paper in the shape of a triangle. Fold over two triangles to make the dog's ears.
- 4. Now you can put a face on your dog. You can draw or glue on googly eyes, draw some spots, or glue on a paddle-pop stick and turn it into a puppet.








