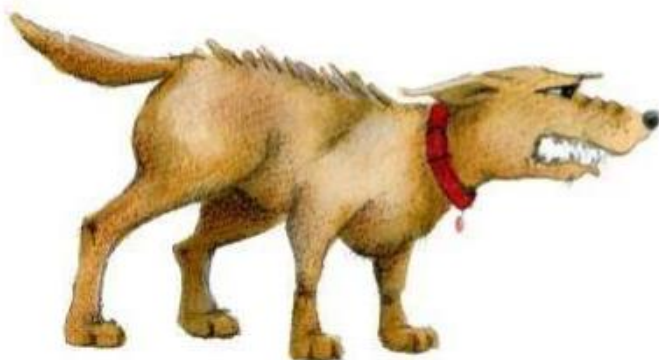

Dogs' Body Language



This dog is feeling **angry**.
How do you know he's feeling angry?

- His ears are flat.
- His tail is held straight out and is not wagging.
- His lips are curled and you can see his teeth.
- His nose is crinkled.
- The hair along his back is standing up.
- His eyes are staring.



This dog is feeling **frightened**.
How do you know he's feeling frightened?

- His tail is tucked between his back legs.
- His ears are down.
- His body is low and slumped.
- His eyes are half-moon – you can see the whites of his eyes.



This dog is feeling **happy**.
How do you know he's feeling happy?

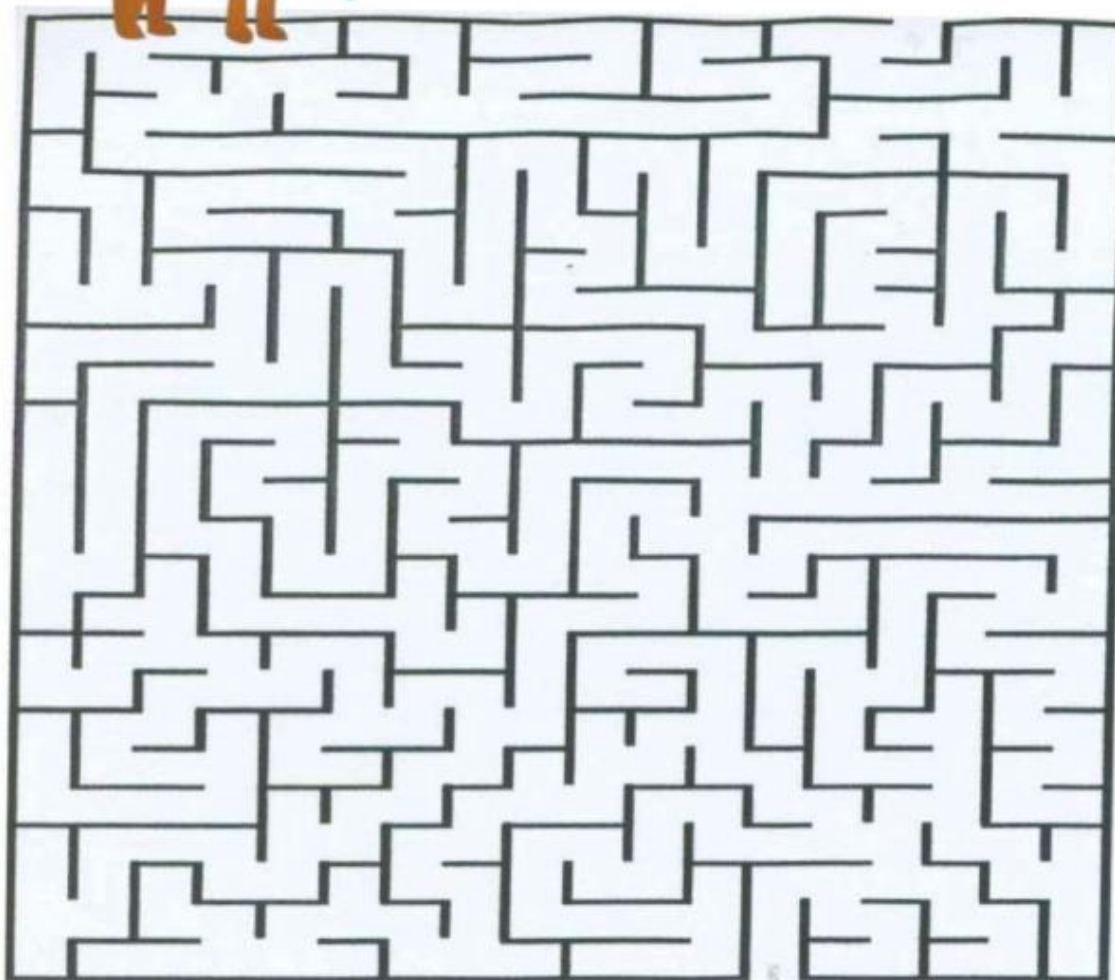
- His tail is wagging.
- His mouth is open and his tongue is lolling.
- His ears are up and facing forward.
- His eyes are open and looking straight ahead.
- He's sitting down.

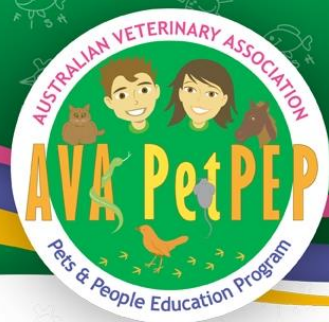

Doggy Origami

Supplies needed:

- Card or construction paper
- Scissors
- Markers or crayons
- Googly eyes, glue and a paddle-pop stick are optional

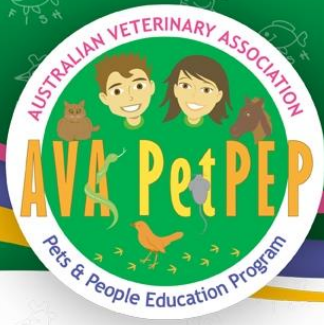


How to Start:

1. Make a square from a piece of paper by folding a corner of the piece of paper over to touch the opposite side.
2. Cut off the small rectangle at the top.
3. Keep your paper in the shape of a triangle. Fold over two triangles to make the dog's ears.
4. Now you can put a face on your dog. You can draw or glue on googly eyes, draw some spots, or glue on a paddle-pop stick and turn it into a puppet.



Have a go at making it look like your favourite dog.



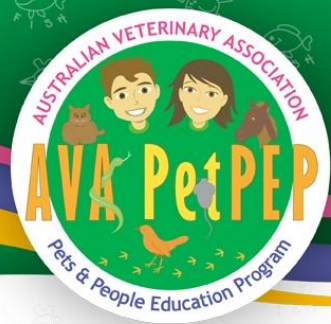

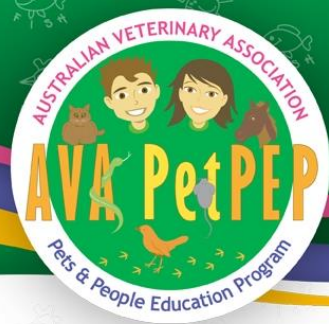

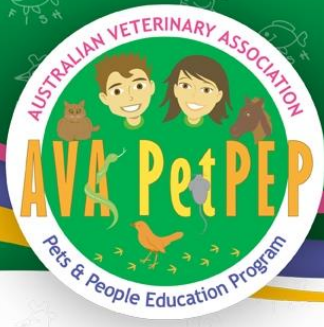
